Life is full of unknowns. It is a universal truth that, despite our best efforts to control and plan, we can never fully predict what tomorrow will bring. In fact, there is something deeply unsettling about the unknown. It evokes fear, anxiety, and doubt. We fear what we cannot see, what we cannot understand. And... it is a fear that we all share.

The realization that all of life is unknowable can either paralyze us or empower us. Once we accept that we will never have all the answers, we unlock the possibility to experience life in an exhilarating and profound manner.

This idea that life is unknowable can feel overwhelming. After all, we are wired to seek certainty, to plan for the future, and to protect ourselves from potential dangers. The very real truth is that there is no way to guarantee that our marriages will be peaceful, that our children will find perfect happiness, or that our dreams will come to fruition exactly as we imagined. Fearing what could go wrong, obsessing and strategizing toward perfect (or even just preferred) outcomes, will only rob us of happiness.

If the unknown is all there ever is and fear is a choice, it makes sense that we could choose to see the unknowns of our lives differently.

Uncertainty is, at its core, an invitation to explore and enact curiosity. What could go right? What gift could I find at this moment? What opportunities are there for my growth? How can I cultivate more trust in the process of my life?

The unknown does not have to be a source of dread; it can be a source of possibility.

Congregation B'nai Torah Religious School Report By Helen Farb



The Religious School Board met, to discuss the Shalom School and the rest of the school year. It is going very smoothly at Beth-El. They have established classrooms and access to bathrooms for children. There are now 77 children enrolled in the school. During the summer we will discuss how to make our facilities more school friendly. The Shalom School will stay at TBE for the 2nd semester with the caveat that CBT hosts festival events at our facilities (e.g. Purim, Model Seder, Mitzvah Day).

If we have these events at CBT we will need <u>many</u> volunteers to help at stations and with food. We want the parents of both synagogues to enjoy events at Congregation B'nai Torah.

The Shalom School will be at Hard Rock Hanukkah on Sunday, December 15 and has many fun family activities planned. CBT will also have a table with Sisterhood and will have many family events. All the children have been practicing their songs and will perform there at noon. Volunteers needed for our booth and the food line.

Trienah and Daniel Y'frah taught music during Rabbi Kane's vacation. They rehearsed the music for Hanukkah. Every week there is a different number of students. On November 3rd ,we covered B'etzelem Elohim (In the image of G-d) and on the November 17th we studied Ometz Lev (Courage of the Heart). In Torah on the 3rd, we covered Eden to Babel and on the 17th we studied Joseph. Finally, in Art we did crafts related to the topics: on the 3rd it was hand mirrors and edible self-portraits, on the 17th everyone made a wheel outlining Joseph's Dream and then an edible version of his coat.

We were finally able to resume our Friday Kid and Tot Shabbat on November 1. It is always fun to sing and eat together. We would encourage more families to come. Many of our students are beginning to participate in the service and would appreciate your support. Our next one will be **Friday, December 6 at 6:00**. Please join us.
