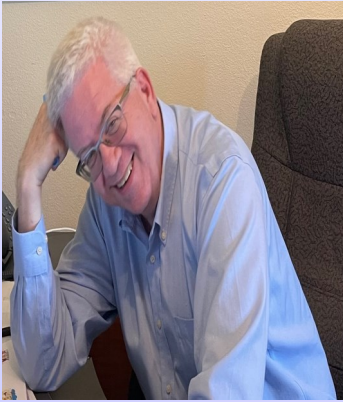

A Message From Rabbi Kane



We have entered the Jewish month of Shevat, which is an improvement, to say the least. Why an improvement, you ask? Because we are theoretically heading out of winter. Why theoretically, you might ask? Because the Jewish calendar has no official start of winter.

One assumes that at some point Jews noticed the nights getting longer and the days colder. Rather than mark the beginning of the noticeable decline of the light, they chose instead to be "light adders" by celebrating Chanukah in the darkest parts of the year.

It's intentional that in this month, six weeks after Chanukah, we have the New Year of the Trees, Tu B'Shevat, which literally means the "fifteen" of the month of "Shevat." Fruit of three-year-old trees had to ripen on or after this date in Israel to be eaten. Amazingly, it occurs on the full moon, when even the darkest part of a 24-hour day is lit by moonlight.

We know that in just one month, we celebrate our victory over the forces of darkness (Haman!) and in two months, we celebrate our peoplehood (Passover!); both also on the full moon.

So what are we to learn about this cycle of light to dark to light?

Perhaps this: If we see a darkness coming, let us not be hypnotized by it, but rather prepare our small light of loving kindness to share with others during the difficulties.

If we see light coming, let us point it out. Perhaps on Tu B'Shevat, winter's grip has challenged people into believing that spring is too far away.

Come to the window on the 15th of Shevat and see the full moon. In one month, under this same moon, we will make merry with hamantaschen and graggers. And in two months under this same moon, we shall celebrate our freedom to choose to help, to have purpose, to be a people in a covenant with God and to be a family that helps each other through the long nights and cold winters.

Come to the window, and in the morning, every morning, let us bring light to each other.

*****KABBALAH KORNER*****

Sharing wisdom from a 3,000 year old mystical tradition

February, 2025 3—30 Shevat, 5785

When we look at growth in our lives and the celebrations that follow, the many opportunities to grow anew each year, to give back to our planet, to friends and families, to total strangers, to perform a mitzvah that will have long lasting impact, I always think of Tu b'Shevat, for as a young boy growing up in Jersey City, I was always excited to plant a tree in Israel, to receive my certificate of authenticity, even if I was really too young to appreciate what it meant, as a Jew, to Israel, and to our Jewish Homeland. Today that viewpoint is quite different, especially in having the opportunity to visit our true homeland with my extended family from B'nai Torah. I would like to share an article from the Kabbalah Center written by Monica Berg.

Tu b'Shevat: Growing, Generously

In his book Days of Power, Rav Berg wrote, "There is more power in the seed than there is in the entire tree. But the power of the seed is potential, while that of the tree is [already] manifested." How could there be more power in a seed than a fully grown Oak Tree?!" The seed is small, almost weightless. It does not bear fruit or have branches—it may as well be a grain of sand on the beach covered in millions of tiny specks that are exactly the same. Yet, once planted, it has all the power to become. However, the tree itself is already grown. Maybe it is not an oak but an olive tree. While it has beautifully manifested itself to grow delicious olives, it can never be an oak tree. Or a peach tree. Or an apple tree. Does this cause it to wilt and stop growing? No. It will continue to produce olives for as long as it lives, which could be more than one thousand years!

MENSCH OF THE MONTH

Helen Farb is known by all in the Congregation B'nai Torah family for her volunteer work in every facet of our temple community. Her extraordinary efforts are not surprising when we learn of a life well lived in respect to love of family, inexhaustible energy, love of learning and teaching and caring for others.

Helen's grandparents immigrated to the United States from Kamenetz Podolski in czarist Russia at the end of the 19th century, arriving in Baltimore. Her father made his way south to Fort Lauderdale, opening a merchandise store that serviced the community, sailors, and Seminole Indians! Helen grew up in the pre-air-conditioning Florida of the 40's and 50's, still experiencing antisemitism. The Jewish community was small and dispersed. It was the Temple that held them together. Helen always wanted to be a teacher, participating in Future Teachers of America in High School.

Helen left home to enter Florida State and in one of those life changing moments, met her future husband Mike on the first day, at a fraternity/sorority party. When he graduated two years later, they married, and Helen interrupted her studies. After a brief stint on the Gulf Coast, a job offer for Mike led to the Farb's relocation to Maryland. Their children Ron and Karen arrived soon after.

When their son Ron was old enough to begin kindergarten, Helen was ready to resume her education. Attending the University of Maryland, she received her degree in early childhood education. Despite moving to more senior jobs, Mike was always a supportive husband, taking care of the children in the evening. Of course, at Helen's student teaching position, she made such an impression that the school immediately hired her full time.

Mike's next job resulted in a relocation to Montgomery County still in Maryland. Helen began a 26-year career teaching kindergarten, first and second grade in one of the finest school districts in Maryland. However, she wished to have a deeper understanding of those children with learning and social adaptation difficulties. She completed her Master's Degree in Special Education at George Washington University. (in addition to full time teaching and raising a family with husband travelling!) For those who marvel at her multi-tasking and energy now; it comes from long practice....

Upon retirement, the Farb's lived the condo life in Volusia County. The children were grown and starting families of their own back in Maryland. For four years, Helen spent (and sometimes Mike) months in Maryland until their last granddaughter graduated high school.

Upon full relocation to Florida in 2000, she employed her formidable experience, expertise, and energy to help make the community a better place as a volunteer. She started supporting the Volusia County School system as a tutor, the Ormond Beach Library, and the Museum of Natural Science. Initially they joined Temple Israel and Helen supported their Sunday School program and other activities. Around 2012, however, the Farb's decided to join CBT, and Helen has volunteered in so many of our activities, Jewish Federation senior luncheons, library, Jewish Heritage Festival and Religious School Director. She also successfully completed the senior Bar/Bat Mitzvah class. For her many extraordinary contributions, she will be given an Award on March 16th by the Jewish Federation "Honoring Heroines and Heroes".

Helen's belief and commitment to Judaism and Israel is strong and deep. Members of her late husband's family live there and her daughter, Karen spent a college semester there. She has travelled with her family there many times. The current turmoil, especially the hostage situation is heartbreaking for her, and she is at times frustrated that their plight has receded from the world's attention. She is proud of our congregation's efforts to support the Federation in providing continued funds for Israel for protective items such as firetrucks and bomb shelters. Having experienced antisemitism as a child, she is sensitive to and apprehensive of signs of it returning.
