## Selling the "Chometz"

The Torah forbids a Jew to own or possess any chometz (bread, cake, beer, etc.) during Passover, so we sell any chometz left after the search and burning to a non-Jew, with a rabbi acting as our agent.

The non-Jewish buyer is told the value of the chometz and its location. He gives a small deposit, and the balance becomes a guaranteed loan. The sale of chometz is legally binding, with the balance to be paid after Passover, but the buyer may return it to the seller and get back his deposit.

Place chometz utensils in the room or closet (s) to be sold. These designated places are sealed with tape or locked, and should not be opened until after Passover.


















# MEN'S CLUB<sup>®</sup>




#### **MEMORIAL BOARD**
