# A Message From Rabbi Kane

So here is something curious.

The prophets are quoted as saying (paraphrasing here) that one day the whole world will know God's name. Sitting here in 5783, a time when we use Adonai (my master), because we hesitate to say God's name incorrectly, it seems like a big hill to climb.



Why do the prophets even regard knowing God's name as desirable?

Jewish theologians and scholars have peered through different lenses searching for an answer.

Classic Judaism might claim that knowing God's name means acknowledging that God is the ultimate Ruler of the world, and so no one would dare disobey God's law. Some later Rabbinic sources might observe that knowing God's name means acknowledging the Creator of all, and in that awareness, being grateful for the miracles of creation. Within that gratitude being incapable of doing selfish acts.

The Kabbalists believed that knowing God's name was not possible, but recognizing the divine spark in each other would be like knowing God on a scale which matched our capacities. Seeing the Divine in each other will call us to mercy and away from unkindness.

Modern Judaism allows us to pick a lens to look through, but looking is troubling.

Why? Because looking leads to questions.

What law do we ignore even though we know it will make our lives better? What do we take for granted in life that leads us to want things more than the things we need? What people are not people to us, because their differences are more important than our common divine humanity?


The answers to these questions are not solutions to anything. They are starting points. Each day we withdraw some time from the bank of eternity. On this anniversary of the destruction of the Holy Temple, not really understanding what was lost, perhaps we can spend time doing more than feeling sadness.

It is in our power to spend our time improving one part of our lives. We must acknowledge our loss, then move on to action.

The bank of eternity is infinite. . . but we are not.

Let seeking God's name lead us to discover our better selves. . . and we may actually find each other.




## **MEMORIAL BOARD**
