A Message From Rabbi Kane

Our sequence of Holidays; Holocaust Remembrance Day, Israel Memorial Day, Israel Independence Day followed by Shavuot is an intention and a story.

Painful memories surface recalling the Holocaust of innocents' suffering. Israel Memorial Day honors those who perished defending the land of Israel; giving their lives for Israel's right to exist. Israel Independence Day marks the continuing success of that struggle.



And then Shavuot, the anniversary of the giving of the Torah.

The pattern here is ours to own.

People will irrationally hurt us. We will learn to fight them to defend our right to exist. We will push back against those who would deny us basic rights until we have established a safe place to live.

And then Shavuot, the acceptance of our obligation to try and make our world a little better.

We appreciate our victories and our safety, but we must also remember to catch our collective breaths and get to our commitment.

Shavuot marks our recognition that we are the chosen people not for our superiority, but rather for our willingness to be a light unto the nations.

"Deeds of goodness, of loving-kindness, " the Rabbis said, "replace the offerings brought to the Temple before it was destroyed."

Perhaps after we experience a time where bad things have happened, we can learn to offer loving kindness as part of our recovery. We will attract to ourselves people who need a kind word and those who appreciate one.






MEMORIAL BOARD
