A Message From Rabbi Kane



There are hurricanes in life. Sometimes they show up on the other side of the country, and sometimes they appear on our doorsteps. Those which are far away do not seem real, more like a TV show.

Those that inflict our lives with risk, harm, damage or loss peel away the illusion of safety that we wrap ourselves in . . . our version of adolescent "invincible" risk taking.

Is it foolish to live in a state with hurricanes; where people have been killed by storms? Is it foolish to live in any risky environment?

Comes the question: Is there anywhere, any life, without risk? Comes the answer: Of course not - but we live with the risk we can tolerate.

But what does all this have to do with being Jewish?

We were created to help when we or someone else encounter a risk that becomes reality; earthquake, hurricane, fire, plague, war, drought, flood . . . the list is endless.

Our ancestors in ancient Persia would send help to peoples in the Holy Land when they were afflicted with earthquakes or plagues. Our parents sent help to Israel when it was a fledgling nation. As Jews were rewarded with affluence in pursuit of the American Dream, they sheltered victims of disaster with medical care, provided scholarships for communities without opportunities, and created research visions to defeat plagues.

This the light unto the nations for a modern era. A people at their best, colorblind in their urge to help; multifaith in their commitment to safety.

We cannot let fire victims in Maui struggle alone, we cannot abandon flood victims in California to living without shelter or food. We couldn't even let war refugees from Syria, an enemy of Israel, go without care.

When disaster strikes, we must help because we are Jewish, and we are Jewish because we must help.



NEW AMBULANCES URGENTLY NEEDED IN ISRAEL

About Magen David Adom (MDA)

Magen David Adom is Israel's national emergency response, blood services, and disaster-relief organization. MDA is recognized as one of the world's leading EMS organizations, a reputation it has earned through responding to years of terrorism, wars and everyday accidents. MDA receives no government funding, and therefore relies on the generosity of our American Friends to support its lifesaving work.

In honor of Israel's 75th, the Federation will donate an ambulance to Israel.

The goal is to raise \$160,000 for an ambulance and equipment for two years.

MDA's Mobile Intensive Care Units (MICUs) are used for the most urgent emergencies. These "Emergency Rooms on Wheels" are equipped with the most innovative medical technology, wirelessly transmitting data to hospitals allowing for doctors and staff to begin immediate medical intervention before the patient even arrives.

Our curriculum will include learning new music by Ellen Allard which will be performed by the children at future events.

This year, I began the semester with 12 students and Morah Virginia with 9. What a great start to what promises to be a terrific year of learning and having fun!

We had a successful clean-up day on August 20th. Thanks to all who came, sweated and organized. As a result of your efforts, the room looks <u>so</u> much better. Thank you also to Rabbi Kane for the delicious lunch we enjoyed afterward at Gili's, the new kosher restaurant beachside on East Granada in Ormond Beach.

We distributed the new school schedule and registration forms on our first day of Religious School, Sunday, August 27th. Thanks to Laurie for putting everything together, helping us to stay somewhat organized during a hectic day.

We had a school board meeting on Monday, August 14th. Rabbi Kane consulted with our parents, and it was decided to expand the school day with a new start time of 9:00 a.m. and to include the new music component. The board voted to maintain tuition at the current level (\$300 a year/\$275 for each additional child from the same family) and to utilize up to 5% of reserve funds for school tuition scholarships.

Virginia, Rabbi Kane, and I look forward to a year of new and exciting events and coming together with Temple Beth-El's children to make beautiful music together!




















Sisterhood in the News
