A Message From Rabbi Kane



Have you ever noticed that the full moon often coincides with both Passover and Sukkot? It is the result of a bit of science applied to religion. Originally, our calendar was an agricultural one, with the cycles of the moon being used to establish the beginning of each month.

Unfortunately, the lunar calendar only has 354 days. Science tells us that it takes about 365

days for a year on earth, so what happened? Holidays began to slip 11 days earlier each year.

Rabbi Hillel II lived in an era when Jewish families were accomplished astronomers (and astrologers!). He was an expert mathematician and set to work on this challenge, developing the Jewish calendar we still use today, 2000 years later.

Judaism often sits at the intersection of religion and science. Was reality created in six 24 hour days? Could be, but maybe not. The important element is that universe was created according to divine plan, not how a day was measured before the sun existed.

Torah reveals nothing about bacteria count in food, but modern Kosher inspectors enforce a standard of cleanliness more stringent than the United States Department of Agriculture.

Science can tell us many things about matter and energy. However it takes a faith tradition like Judaism to teach us how to measure and weigh our actions in order to change the trajectory of our lives.

So let us take full advantage of the launchpad; the holidays afford us to point our lives in the direction of bettering ourselves, to the benefit of all whose lives touch our own.





He has performed in over a hundred countries, and wrote and starred in Six Impossible Things, an acclaimed immersive magic show that ran in New York City for over two years. In 2020 the Society of American Magicians named Joshua "Magician of the Year" for his contributions to the art of magic.


