# A Message From Rabbi Kane

Benjamin Franklin has been quoted and misquoted throughout the last 200 years for writing, "There was never a good war or a bad peace." Humanity seems very far from understanding the futility of war. There seems to be some insanity driven by international convention that war on innocents is less virtuous than war on soldiers.

Is the premise that 19-year-olds are worth less than 9-year-olds or 99-year-olds? Or is it only right if the battle is between people who can actually kill each other? Or is it military strength? Is the soldier dropping a concrete block from a 5th floor window a better person than the one carrying an automatic weapon because he is trying to kill one at a time?

Trying to find virtue in war is like trying to change the past; but humanity keeps at it. When will barbarism finally fade from the earth? It's like the Rabbis trying to answer the question, "When will the Messiah come?" One opinion, "The world will get worse and worse until only the Messiah can save it." Another opinion, "The world will get better and better until only the Messiah can perfect it."

A Jewish life could last 120 years, so middle age might be from 41-80 years old. So let's accept that I am middle-aged for a moment. I have seen some of life; birth and death, sickness and health, kindness and cruelty, mercy and execution, love and indifference. I have seen the world get worse and I have seen it get better.

I have watched people climb over one another for money or power, strangers inflict hatred on strangers, war rage in dozens of countries, innocents claimed by drugs created to addict them. And we have refused to forgive. And we have passed up chances to do good and to do well. And that is why the world is getting worse.

Also, I have watched people walking on the moon, patients recover from cancer, peace break out in Ireland, addicts find their footing to restart their lives. And we have been forgiven so many times we lose count. And we have been given so many chances to do good and to do well. And that is why the world is getting better.

Barbarism is its own fuel. Can Barbarians be frightened into peace? Beaten? Killed? And will the cost of defeating barbarism be to become barbarians? The anguish in Israel is palpable, "How can this happen in our place of safety?" "Do what you must to get our safety back."

It is easy to be horrified by war. And it seems we ought to be. And yet, it is not our children murdered and mutilated, raped and kidnapped. So what do we do? What should we do? Cheer for the military? Cry for the innocents? Hate the barbarians? Ask God to destroy them and to forgive us for needing their destruction so much? Oh Lord of all, grant

And while we wait for peace to conclude war, we will study and create, listen and understand forgive who we can, find ways to do good and do well. We promise to do what we can to make our world better . . .
