

At Ormond In the Pines we were together to sing Hanukkah songs to the seniors. This is always a wonderful event for everyone involved.


Hard Rock Hanukkah was also a fantastic event for all. We had face painters, crafts, and fortune tellers (cootie catchers to us old folks).

#### IMPORTANT UPDATE REGARDING THE PROPOSED MERGER WITH TEMPLE ISRAEL

At our last annual congregation meeting we passed a resolution to proceed with a merger of our two congregations. The intent of the merger was to create one conservative Jewish congregation to serve Ormond Beach and the immediate surrounding area. Numerous discussions were had but unfortunately due to legal issues with regard to our individual corporate entities it was decided to cease merger discussions and revert to the current cohabitation agreement that was consummated in August of 2022.

Even though we are not proceeding with the merger we did accomplish our mutual goal. Thecongregants from Temple Israel accepted Aliyahs and otherwise attended and participated in all of the high holiday services. Their members were made to feel welcome and comfortable as evidenced by their continued attendance at our functions and services either in person or via Zoom. In addition, many Temple Israel members have established a nice rapport with Rabbi Kane.

In closing, we are happy to report that even though we have not merged legally we have clearly merged spiritually.

All orders must be in by January 30th.


