

#### A Message From Rabbi Kane



This month, I would like to share some advice from the address historian Ken Burns made to the graduates of Brandeis University. It seems to me that these ideas may be good for all of us, not just 22 year olds:

Listen. Be curious, not cool. Insecurity makes liars of us all. Remember, none of us get out of here alive. The inevitable vicissitudes of life, no matter how well gated our

communities, will visit us all. Grief is a part of life, and if you explore its painful precincts, it will make you stronger.

Do good things, help others. Leadership is humility and generosity squared. Remember the opposite of faith is not doubt. Doubt is central to faith. The opposite of faith is certainty. The kinship of the soul begins with your own at times withering self-examination. Try to change that unchangeable human nature of Ecclesiastes, but start with you. "Nothing so needs reforming," Mark Twain once chided us, "As other people's habits."

Don't confuse success with excellence. Do not descend too deeply into specialism. Educate all of your parts, you will be healthier. Do not get stuck in one place. "Travel is fatal to prejudice," Twain also said.

Be in nature, which is always perfect and where nothing is binary. Its sheer majesty may remind you of your own atomic insignificance, as one observer put it, but in the inscrutable and paradoxical ways of wild places, you will feel larger, inspirited, just as the egotist in our midst is diminished by his or her self-regard.

At some point, make babies, one of the greatest things that will happen to you, I mean it, one of the greatest things that will happen to you is that you will have to worry, I mean really worry, about someone other than yourself. It is liberating and exhilarating, I promise. Ask your parents.

Choose honor over hypocrisy, virtue over vulgarity, discipline over dissipation, character over cleverness, sacrifice over self-indulgence. Do not lose your enthusiasm, in its Greek etymology the word enthusiasm means simply, "god in us". Serve your country. Insist that we fight the right wars. Denounce oppression everywhere.

Convince your government, as Lincoln understood that the real threat always and still comes from within this favored land. Insist that we support science and the arts, especially the arts. They have nothing to do with the actual defense of our country; They just make our country worth defending.

Remember what Louis Brandeis said, "The most important political office is that of the private citizen." Vote. You indelibly... [audience applauding] Please, vote. You indelibly underscore your citizenship, and most important, our kinship with each other when you do. Good luck and godspeed.

## Congregation B'nai Torah Religious School Report By Helen Farb



Our year was filled with many activities involving families, music and holiday events. The school grew to 24 students. Ellen Allard came to teach the children music for the holidays. It was a privilege to have her on many occasions, especially at Hard Rock Hanukkah. Our school hours changed to 9:00-2:00 to include our new music. We also started to collaborate with Dr. Jonathan Frankel, the school director from Beth-El. Our children joined theirs for music practice, a Hanukkah Carnival, and singing at Hard Rock Hanukkah and the Jewish Heritage Festival.

The students learned the stories and traditions of each holiday through Parsha study, crafts, books and food. For the High Holidays, Jonah and the whale was a wonderful play. Our students and parents made many decorations for our Sukkah and were able to enjoy eating in it. The Sukkah was beautiful, thanks to all who built it. At Simchot Torah, everyone got a chance to hold and dance with Torahs. The reading of the Megillah in March is another holiday to celebrate and enact the story of Esther with costumes, groggers and hamantashen.

Our children had many opportunities to do mitzvah's for others. In November we were joined by Chanah Zimmerman while Virginia was on vacation. The children and the Beth-El student came together at Ormond in the Pines Nursing Home to sing Hanukkah songs and play dreidel. The residents really enjoyed seeing and hearing the children. In November, the students made cupcakes for the Veterans and presented them at a special Shabbat service. In December, Virginia introduced the children to the Heifer Project and the children started collecting money for a cow. The cow would be sent to a poor villages to use for milk and calves. The calves would be given to other villages for breeding with working bulls in these villages. We got a beautiful certificate back.

We invited Beth-El students in February to join us for Mitzvah Day. The activities were: homemade soup jars for Federation and a perishable food collection; dog items (cages, food, blankets) for Sophie's' Circle, a dog rescue group; cards for the sick and elderly; and bird houses constructed and painted. In March, the students made 30 Shalot Manot bags filled with many wonderful treats. They delivered them to many of our congregants

To prepare for the Model seder, the parents and students made Charosis, matzoh ball soup and pineapple, matzoh kugel. The food was delicious! Talia and Sam sang the Four Questions beautifully.

It was lovely to celebrate together. Thanks to all the parents who helped!

On our last day, we celebrated with Shavuot activities. Rabbi Kane discussed the Ten Commandments. He brought out one of the Torah's to show different parts of the text. Our parents and students always enjoy and cheer for our traditional last day kickball game. At 11:00 we went to the park across from the synagogue and joined Beth-El students and parents in games and food. It was so lovely to meet new parents and students.

The religious school would like to thank Virginia Horowitz for all she has done to enrich, educate and contribute to our children and parents and especially myself. Morah Virginia introduced many way to perform Mitzvahs, and brought many new ideas for celebrating the holidays: a TuB'Shevat seder, Parshas, and Kid and Tot Shabbat stories and plays for the students. The children, Rabbi and I will miss your enthusiasm, insight. humor and your love. We wish she and Larry the best of everything in France!

Many thanks to Chanah Zimmerman and Valerie Kisseloff for coming when substitute teachers were needed. Thanks to Lisa Ravede, Jared Kisseloff, Navah Aaron son, Acacia Myers, and Ana Chuven for coming in as classroom assistants to work with the 3-4 year olds. Our religious school can not function without the direction of Rabbi Kane. His many ideas and his love of Jewish music have brought us many opportunities for growth. The parents and students look forward to the Friday night Kid and Tot Shabbat dinners and services. As many of you know, I am resigning as a teacher but I will work with Dr. Jonathan Frankel and Rabbi Kane during the summer and fall to help our Religious School working smoothly as we merge with the Sunday school of Beth-El. 
