A Message From Rabbi Kane

Dear Fellow Congregants and Rabbi Kane,

I hope you are all doing well as we move closer to the High Holidays and the end of the Jewish Year 5785. An eventful year would be an understatement. So, as we do in our wonderful culture, I am going to blend a little bit from here and a little bit from there to share my message to you as we move into 5786.

As Elul is the last month in the Jewish yearly cycle before Rosh Hashanah, Elul is viewed as a month of reflection on the previous year and looking forward to the next year. With this focus, Elul is regarded as a month of Teshuva, forgiveness and beginning with a clean slate.

As I approach my 16th month of the presidency here at B'nai Torah, I am moved by the acts of kindness and support you have all shared, and for that I am grateful. We continue to have challenges too, from growing our Congregation, maintaining an aging facility, and having a healthy flow of financial support. We have accomplished a great deal, but not enough. 



MENSCH OF THE MONTH

September “Mensch of the Month” George Selis

Our Mensch of the Month for September, George Selis, has lived a full and happy 93 years, always with a sense of optimism. He has had some fortunate occurrences and has had the energy and drive to take advantage of them. Congregation B’nai Torah has been a beneficiary; possibly we would not exist without his special efforts.

George’s ancestors left Poland, then part of the czarist empire, around the end of the 19th century, settling in the New York area. His parents were from Brooklyn and the Bronx, and he grew up in a one-bedroom walk-up apartment with his sister in Brooklyn. His father worked in the sanitation department and mother in a department store. In the 1930’s depression, it was fortunate that they were working!

With the Korean War beginning, George got his mother to sign a waiver so he could enlist in the navy at 17, to avoid the Army draft. But he got so seasick on the Staten Island Ferry going to his enlistment that he abruptly switched and joined the army. He was sent to Germany, however. He remembers a bleak devastated country with a resentful population.

One of life’s turning points came the day he left the army as that was the day he met Eileen. After a five-month romance, they were married, and it stayed that way for a happy 72 years. George got a job at the United Nations. It was not high diplomacy; he worked in maintenance keeping the air conditioning and heating running. However, while he was working there, he and Eileen managed to purchase the drugstore under the apartment that he grew up in. They turned it into a soda fountain and named it “The Klink.” The staff wore prison uniforms. The desserts featured “the Alcatraz Float” which was an ice cream sundae, the “Wardens Delight”, a banana split and “Solitary Confinement” a single ice cream scoop. George worked there evenings after his day job.

After 13 years at the UN, George was ready for something new and took a job as a Manager of a New York Beltone Franchise, selling hearing aids. After several years, he learned the Beltone business thoroughly but despite his best efforts was unable to purchase the franchise. So, in 1975 he and Eileen decide to make a fresh start in Miami. Using the funds he had accumulated in hopes of purchasing the New York Beltone franchise, he purchased a restaurant, “The Humdinger.” Unfortunately, “The Humdinger” did not live up to its name and went under. Then one of life’s coincidences happened and George took full advantage. Looking for employment, he answered a generic ad looking for someone with sales experience. It turned out to be Beltone’s Miami franchise. George interviewed and of course got the job. They were amazed how quickly he “learned the business...” In no time at all he was running the place. He purchased the Daytona Beach Franchise and was eventually instrumental in owning fourteen offices with over 200 employees, together with his son Mark, to complete a successful career, before retiring in a beautiful seaside condominium in Ormond Beach.

George came from a secular Jewish family, only celebrating the holidays with his grandparents. Eileen's side was more religious, and their two boys received a Jewish education and became bar mitzvah, Mark while they were still in New York, and Scott in Miami. When they settled in Ormond Beach, they joined Temple Israel and George served as President. However, along with the "original seven" they found the working of that congregation too restrictive and the group that included four other past presidents of Temple Israel formed our Congregation B'nai Torah. George was central to that effort, particularly in the fundraising and was tireless, especially in the early years, in doing whatever he could to build the foundations of the successful congregation we all enjoy. He proudly experienced his Bar Mitzvah at age 72 at Congregation B'nai Torah.

George has traveled to Israel twice and has a strong attachment to that country. He believes Israel can take care of itself and should not be unduly influenced by outside pressure. There is still antisemitism in the world, and we need a home.

After a wonderful 72-year partnership, raising two sons with professional careers (younger son Scott is an attorney in Ormond Beach practicing elder law), six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren, George lost his beloved wife Eileen. However, at 93, he considers every day of good health a blessing. He enjoys his family, temple friends and has never lost his sense of optimism. He has always tried to make things better and our world is a better place because of him.


